

# Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, April 5, 2022

The regular Six Mile Town Council meeting was held April 5, 2022, starting at 7:00 pm at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh, Jadd Smith, and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on April 1, 2022.

## **Call to Order & Invocation**

Mayor Stoddard gave the invocation and then led the pledge of allegiance.

## **Committee Reporting**

**Safety:** Chairperson Yongue gave the statistics report from the Pickens County Sheriff's office.

**Recreation:** Chairperson Smith reported that the gates that were stolen from Ponderosa Park have been replaced. Red White and Brew (RW&B) will provide concessions during this season and the games will begin this week.

**Administration:** Chairperson Bedenbaugh had nothing to report.

**Budget:** Councilperson Atkinson asked Council if they could have a budget meeting on April 27 at noon, and all agreed. He stated that we should start on the process of bidding out the Audit for the FY23 year.

**Mayor's Report:** The mayor reported that Trey Merck is starting a law office in the building across the street, next to the barbershop. The bid package for the pavilion at the Community Park will be ready to go April 20.

## **Consent Agenda**

Council consented to the approval of the minutes from March 1, 2022, Council Meeting.

## **Action Item:**

Mayor Stoddard made a motion to use up to \$5,000.00 from the general fund for this year's Independence Day Celebration; Councilman Yongue made the second. Councilperson Bedenbaugh has approximately \$5,000.00 in donations committed. The only date the fireworks vendor had open is Sunday, July 3<sup>rd</sup>. The cost of the fireworks will be about \$10K. She's hoping to get more donations and we might not have to use the entire \$5K. The vote to use this money for the fireworks was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard moved to go into Executive Session at 7:28 for the purpose of discussing contractual matters. Councilperson Bedenbaugh made the second and the vote to go into Executive Session was unanimous. Mayor Stoddard called the meeting back to regular session and asked if there were any motions from Executive Session and was told there were none.
