

Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, November 1, 2022

The regular meeting of the Six Mile Town Council was held November 1, 2022, starting at 6:30 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on October 31, 2022.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked Councilperson Bedenbaugh to give the invocation and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Public Session:

Councilman Atkinson introduced a representative from Upstate Forever, Chris Stark, to hold the second public hearing for the Conservation Easement that they are establishing for the Bryson Children's Nature Walk. He explained the easement and an opportunity was offered for public comments. There were none. The Mayor then asked Amy Goodin, the Halloween Coordinator, to come forward and tell us about the Halloween activities from the night before, which were a huge success.

Committee Reporting

Safety: Chairman Yongue gave the report from the Pickens County Sheriff's Office.

Recreation: The Recreation Director, Tim Friar, said the season finished up week before last. One team went to a tournament in Dacusville and won; they will bring the trophy to town hall to display

Administration: Chairperson Bedenbaugh said that the wives of the firemen are planning to help with fundraising for the 2023 Independence Day celebration.

Budget: Chairman Atkinson told Council that he and the clerks are working with banking representatives to get better rates on our money market accounts and checking with ecommerce companies about merchant services.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Stoddard said he, the architect and the engineer are still diligently working to get the pavilion built for the community park.

Consent Agenda

The minutes from October 11, 2022, were approved.

Action Items

Councilmember Atkinson made a motion to accept the second reading to approve the request for rezoning of the property located at 199 Aaron Drive, to commercial, as recommended by the Planning Commission.

Councilman Bedenbaugh made the second and the vote to rezone this area was unanimous.


Adjourn:
