

Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, March 1, 2022

The regular Six Mile Town Council meeting was held March 1, 2022, starting at 7:00 pm at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on February 28, 2022.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked Councilperson Bedenbaugh to give the invocation; he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Committee Reporting

Safety: Chairperson Yongue gave the statistics report from the PC Sheriff's office

Recreation: Clerk Martin reported that Spring registration ended February 15 and teams have been formed, coaches assigned, and practices will start soon.

Administration: Chairperson Bedenbaugh suggested that we cancel the Independence Day Festival since our major donor for the fireworks is no longer backing them, and since this is coming up in this fiscal year and there is nothing budgeted for it. Other members were hesitant to give it up completely so she will check with the supplier and see when the deposit is due.

Budget: Councilperson Atkinson said the current budget was looking fine. No date has been scheduled for the next FY23 budget meeting.

Mayor's Report: The mayor reported that the trustee for the Bryson estate is recovering from Covid; once he is well, the closing on the 65 acres gifted from the estate will be scheduled.

The bidding process for the pavilion at the Community Park is in the making.

Consent Agenda

Council consented to the approval of the minutes from the, February 1, 15, and 24, 2022 Council Meetings.

Action Item:

Councilperson Atkinson made a motion to approve the second reading to increase the FY22 budget by \$105,702 to \$464,251 to reflect receipt of ARPA lost revenue funds, such funds to be expended for use on the Community Park and Bryson Children's Nature Walk projects. Councilperson Bedenbaugh made the second and the vote was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard moved to go into Executive Session at 7:20 for the purpose of discussing the human resource line items for the FY23 Budget. Councilperson Bedenbaugh made the second and the vote to go into Executive Session was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard called the meeting back to regular session and asked if there were any motions from Executive Session. Councilman Atkinson made a motion to raise the Clerk's salary by 3% in the FY23 Budget. Councilperson Bedenbaugh made the second and vote passed unanimously
