

Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, June 7, 2022

The regular meeting of the Six Mile Town Council was held June 7, 2022, starting at 7 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson and Jadd Smith, thus meeting a quorum. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on June 6, 2022.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard gave the invocation, and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Public Hearing

The Mayor opened the public hearing for the budget for FY23. Mr. Bob Lewis, of 2312 Liberty Highway, asked a couple of very general questions about the budget. After answering all questions from the public, the Mayor closed the public hearing and opened the regular session of the meeting.

Committee Reporting

Safety: In Chairman Yongue's absence, Clerk Martin read the report from the Pickens County Sheriff's Office.

Recreation: Chairman Smith told Council that a volunteer workday is planned at Ponderosa Park on June 18. There will be two teams playing in the Allstars this Spring. He mentioned that there are several issues with maintenance at the park and the Mayor asked for those in writing so that he could speak to the County Maintenance Office. Fall Registration is open June 1 thru July 15. He and Tim Friar are looking into the possibility of offering soccer and flag football in the future.

Budget: Chairman Atkinson stated that the current budget would not end as well as others, but still not bad considering the rising costs of living. He told Council that he has put the audit for FY24 out for bid. All bids should be received by June 25, 2022.

Consent Agenda

The minutes from May 3, 2022, were approved.

Action Items


Councilperson Atkinson made a motion to accept the second reading to rescind using \$5000.00 from the general fund for firework show for Independence Day Celebration; Councilperson Smith made the second, and the vote was unanimous.

Councilman Atkinson made a motion to accept the second reading of the proposed balanced Budget for FY23 of \$457,210.00. and the balanced NR Recreation Budget in the amount of \$11,650.00. Councilman Smith made the second and the vote to accept the second reading was unanimously accepted.
