

Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, October 11, 2022

The regular meeting of the Six Mile Town Council was held October 11, 2022, starting at 7 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Jadd Smith, and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on October 7, 2022.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked Councilman Yongue to give the invocation and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Public Session:

Mayor Stoddard then turned the floor over to Shoaleh Young, the Chairperson of the Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Pickens County. She recited some information about their organization and then gave each Council member a framed copy of the "Golden Rule".

Mayor Stoddard told Council that there will be no Executive Session tonight, so #'s 8 and 9 of this agenda will be deleted.

Committee Reporting

Safety: Chairman Yongue gave the report from the Pickens County Sheriff's Office.

Recreation: Chairman Smith said there are three more weeks of fall ball. They still need one more member for the Recreation Board and they are waiting for an application from Mark Reeves. The next meeting of the Recreation Board will be held on October 25. The board will be taking opinions from the public about starting flag football

Administration: Chairperson Bedenbaugh was absent

Budget: Chairman Atkinson told Council that he is working to get a better rate on our investments. He is also reviewing our credit card payment system thinking of changing to different vendors to save on fees.

He has sent in a few changes to the Auditor on the FY22 audit that Gary Bailey sent to us tentatively.

The Bryson Children's Nature Walk is hopefully going to be finalized by the end of the year.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Stoddard reported that we are still trying to find someone to build the pavilion at the community park. We are now considering using wood as opposed to steel due to the availability and cost of materials.

Consent Agenda

The minutes from September 6, 2022, were approved.

Action Items

Councilmember Atkinson made a motion to accept the first reading to approve the request for rezoning of the property located at 199 Aaron Drive, to commercial, as recommended by the Planning Commission.

Councilman Smith made the second and the vote to rezone this area was unanimous.
