

Special Called/Budget Council Meeting

Tuesday, February 15, 2022

A Special Called meeting of the Six Mile Town Council was held February 15, 2022, starting at 6:00 pm at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh, Jadd Smith and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on February 14, 2022.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked James Atkinson to give the invocation and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Public Session:

No one from the public was in attendance.

Action Item:

Councilman Atkinson made a motion to accept the first reading to increase the current FY22 budget by \$105,702 to \$464,251 to reflect receipt of ARPA lost revenue funds, such funds to be expended for use on the Community Park and Bryson Children's Nature Walk Projects. Councilman Yongue made the second and after some discussion the vote was passed unanimously.

Budget Session:

After consulting individually with each event coordinator for the Issaqueena Festival, Farmers Depot, Independence Day and Christmas events, Council discussed each event. Having lost our major donor for the Independence Day fireworks, Council tried to decide whether the Town could continue to do a fireworks show for July 4. The Christmas events for 2021 were extra special as it was the 50th year of the Christmas parade, therefore, Council tried to determine how much they could reduce that budget and maybe lend some toward the fireworks. After detailed discussion, it was decided that on February 24, they would ask Amy Goodin and Kayla Holtzclaw to attend and further discuss the exact amounts that would be needed for their events in FY23.


Adjourn:
