

Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, February 7, 2023

The first budget meeting for FY24 followed by the regular meeting of the Six Mile Town Council was held February 7, 2023, starting at 6:00 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh, Jadd Smith, and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on February 6, 2023.

Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked Councilperson Atkinson to give the invocation and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

Budget Meeting:

Mayor Stoddard asked Amy Goodin to report how her current budget is going for the Issaqueena Festival and what she is expecting for the coming fiscal year and then for the Halloween Festival. Mayor Stoddard then asked Council person Bedenbaugh for the same information for the Independence Day Festival. Mayor Stoddard then called for a short recess.

Public Session:

Mayor Stoddard called the meeting back to order and asked members of the public, Andy and Robbie Tweito, to speak to Council. They were representing Edens Ridge Subdivision and wanted to address the fact that the Town is no longer providing garbage pickup. He asked several questions and Council answered them seemingly to their satisfaction.

Committee Reporting

Safety: Chairman Yongue gave the report from the Pickens County Sheriff's Office.

Recreation: Councilman Smith reported that the flag football signups ended with approximately 66 players. Also, Spring Baseball and Softball signups have finished. Ryan Smith, the Chairman of the Recreation Board is acting Recreation Director while the position is vacant. The Rec Board has put in a request with the County to supplement some funds toward the hiring of a full-time position that would be for maintenance and the duties of the director. Meanwhile, he and the Rec Board plus many volunteers are handling all the activities and fund raising at Ponderosa Park.

Administration: Chairperson Bedenbaugh is planning the Independence Day Celebration for July 3, 2023 from 5 until the fireworks. Katie Rampey is going to have a farmers market that day (Monday instead of her normal Tuesday that week). Also, there will be concessions available.

Budget: Chairman Atkinson reported that all looks good at this point in the current budget. He is still working on the FY24 budget and the next work session is Thursday, the 9th at 6pm.

Consent Agenda

Approval of Minutes for January 3, 26 and 31, 2023

Action Items

Councilmember Atkinson made a motion accept the second reading of Ordinance # 02072023: Schedule of Fees; Council Person Bedenbaugh made the second. Councilman Atkinson stated that there were two minor amendments to the fee schedule (a \$75 Conditional Use Permit Fee and instead of the Food Trucks obtaining a Peddler's License for the Farmer's Market, it will be called a Food Truck Fee). The vote to accept the second reading of the Ordinance enforcing the new schedule of fees was passed unanimously.
