

# Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, May 2, 2023

The regular Six Mile Town Council meeting was held May 2, 2023, starting at 7:00 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: Jadd Smith and Tommy Yongue, thus meeting a quorum. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on May 1, 2023.

## **Call to Order & Invocation**

Mayor Stoddard gave the invocation and then led the pledge of allegiance.

## **Public Session**

Bob Lewis asked if the Family Dollar Tree that is being built at 2312 Liberty Highway is going to have its entrance on Aaron Drive or Liberty Highway. Councilman Smith answered that the store will be accessible from Liberty Highway.

## **Committee Reporting**

**Safety:** Chairman Yongue gave the safety report from the Sheriff's Office for the month.

**Recreation:** Chairman Jadd Smith said that the Recreation Board is going to post the job/contract for the Recreation Director. They have enough funds donated to start a soccer program; there are 96 kids interested in soccer for the fall. Registration for Soccer, Cheerleading and Flag Football (6U) will start in June. Tackle football for 10U is full and the rest will go on a waiting list. Diamond Day was a success with over \$2400 coming in. They are trying to get trash pickup scheduled for Ponderosa Park, whether it be with the County or a private vendor. The quotes he has now are from Waste Management (\$143) per month and Republic (\$206) per month.

**Administration:** Mayor Stoddard stated that Chairperson Bedenbaugh has the Independence Day Celebration all set for July 3.

**Budget:** Mayor Stoddard said that the budget looks on track for this fiscal year.

**Mayor's Report:** Mayor Stoddard stated that he has a meeting this coming Monday with the design team in relation to the pavilion at the Community Park. He also mentioned that Jenni and Jared Brink from Red White and Brew had asked about constructing an outside door giving access to the restroom from the outside of the old fire station at 102 S Main Street. This would alleviate the lack of a public restroom for them and the restroom issue when the Farmer's Market is being held over there. The Mayor asked if Council wanted to pursue this by getting quotes and Council consented.

## **Consent Agenda**

The minutes for the May 2, 2023, meeting were approved.

## **Action Items**

Mayor Stoddard made a motion to accept the first reading of The Fire Service Agreement for Pickens County. The purpose of this new agreement is to take the 13 individual districts down to one district so that fire fees can be consistent countywide. Councilmember Yongue made the second and the vote to accept the first reading of this agreement was unanimous.

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Mayor Stoddard made a motion to accept the first reading of the FY24 Budget in the amount of \$549,658 along with the Non-Reverting Recreation Budget in the amount of \$44,250. Note: Council has elected not to take any funds from the Non-Reverting funds to pay the Recreation Director's salary as was discussed earlier. Councilman Yongue made the second and the vote to pass the first reading of the FY24 budget was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard made a motion to accept the second reading of Ordinance number 05022023, intergovernmental agreement relating to SC revenue services. Councilmember Yongue made the second and the vote to adopt this Ordinance was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard made a motion to go into Executive Session per SC State Code Section 30-4-70(a) Committee Resignation and Councilmember Smith made the second. The vote to go into Executive Session was unanimous.


Mayor Stoddard called the meeting back into regular session and asked if there were any motions. Councilman Smith made a motion to accept the resignation letter of Ron Patrick from the Planning Commission. Councilmember Yongue made the second and the vote was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard adjourned the meeting at 7:40 PM.
