

# Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, April 17, 2024

A special called Council meeting was held by the Six Mile Town Council at Town Hall (106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C.) on April 17, 2024, at 1:00 PM. Members in attendance were Mayor James Atkinson: Presiding; Council: Mark Beckman, Beau Proffitt, and Judy Shaw. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on April 16, 2024.

## **Call to Order & Invocation**

Mayor Atkinson asked Councilman Proffitt to give the Invocation and asked Councilperson Shaw to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Public Session:**

Jenny Brink, owner of Red White & Brew asked to speak about several issues pertaining to her business.

## **Committee Reporting**

**Public Health and Safety:** Chairman Smith was absent.

**Recreation:** Chairperson Proffitt said that Flag Football is mid-season, Baseball and Soccer are just finishing, and registration for Cheerleading is now open for the fall and Tackle Football registration will start next week. He also said that the new press box will be installed at the football field this week. He mentioned that he would like to implement some first aid training for the volunteer coaches in the near future.

**Building/Grounds/IT:** Chairperson Beckman told Council that the door buzzer is being installed today. He discussed continued work at the Downtown Pavilion.

**HR/Special Projects/Aesthetics:** Judy Shaw is working to create a new Employee Personnel Handbook from the MASC Model Handbook. She discussed work in process at the front of Town Hall.

**Administration/Finance:** Mayor Atkinson gave a quick summation of the millage rates for all the municipalities in Pickens County. Six Mile's is by far the lowest at 31.1 mills (which is offset by the Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) such that annual total Town Real Estate Tax collections approximate only \$1,500). A potential millage change to the allowed maximum for 2024-2025 of 5.7 mills would be totally offset by the LOST with therefore no dollar tax effect on town citizens for this year. The Town of Six Mile cannot receive back more LOST than the taxation.

## **Action Items**

Councilperson Beckman made a motion to accept the second reading for an amendment to Ordinance # 8012023 requiring that design and construction of all newly constructed Town facilities, with applicability to this Ordinance, shall be in compliance with the Town Zoning Ordinance. Councilperson Shaw seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

## **Executive Session:**

Councilman Beckman made a motion at to go into Executive Session per SC State Code Section 30-4-70(a) legal and personnel matters; Councilperson Shaw made the second and the vote to go into Executive Session was unanimous.

Mayor Atkinson called the meeting back to regular session and asked if there were any motions to come from Executive Session.

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Councilmember Shaw made a motion to appoint Randy Hammers to the Board of Zoning Appeals, effective immediately. Councilmember Beckman made the second and the vote to accept this appointment was unanimous.

Councilmember Proffitt made a motion to accept a bid from Robert Crenshaw for Crenshaw Asphalt Paving Incorporated to pave the parking lot of Town Hall. Councilmember Beckman made the second and the vote passed unanimously.


Councilmember Beckman made a motion to authorize Mayor Atkinson to execute an Easement Agreement between the Town of Six Mile and Six Mile Assisted Living, Councilman Proffitt made the second and the vote passed unanimously.

Mayor Atkison adjourned the meeting at 2:35 PM.
