

# Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, April 11, 2023

The regular Six Mile Town Council meeting was held April 11, 2023, starting at 7:00 PM at 106 South Main Street, Six Mile, S.C. Members in attendance were Mayor Roy Stoddard, presiding; Council: James Atkinson, Karen Bedenbaugh, Jadd Smith, and Tommy Yongue. The agenda was emailed to the Pickens County Courier and the Journal on April 10, 2023.

## Call to Order & Invocation

Mayor Stoddard asked Councilperson Smith to give the invocation and he then led the pledge of allegiance.

## Public Session

Kyle and Christy Schultz were in attendance. They stated that they wanted to speak about the Recreation Department.

## Committee Reporting

Safety: Chairman Yongue gave the safety report from the Sheriff's Office for the month.

Recreation: Chairman Jadd Smith said that Flag Football season is going great along with spring baseball and softball; the park is "busting at the seams". Signups are April 17<sup>th</sup> through May 15 for tackle football (10U and 8U) and cheerleading. There are only 22 spots available for each age group in football because that was how many sets of equipment that the Board had raised funds for at this time. He bragged on the exuberance of this Recreation Board, who are willing to work, raise money, and find volunteers to help with every aspect of making the Recreation Department thrive.

The Schultz's both had high praise for the newly established Recreation Board and loved the positive direction that they are taking the Recreation Department.

Administration: The Independence Day Festival is set for July 3 at Ponderosa Park. Chairperson Bedenbaugh said that Field One is being seeded and won't be available for them to use that day, but they would work around it.

Budget: Chairman Atkinson said that we are at a standstill on our FY24 budget because we need numbers from Non-Reverting Recreation, County Recreation funds and PARD Grant.

Mayor's Report: The awnings on the front of town hall must be replaced. The March winds blew one into pieces. Clerk Martin has obtained an estimate of \$3060.00 and is waiting for another quote. Since this job should cost less than \$5000, the mayor has the authority to contract this job.

Since our November Council meeting falls on election day, he asked if the Council would consent to have the meeting on Monday, November 6, and everyone agreed.

Mayor Stoddard had asked that all Council members ride through all the roads inside town limits and let him know which one is in most need of repair. He mentioned also that we are waiting for one more contractor to put in a bid for the pavilion.

## Consent Agenda

The minutes for the March 7 meeting were approved.

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## Action Items

Councilman Atkinson made a motion to accept the second reading of the FY22 Audit as presented by Gary Bailey, the second was made by Councilperson Bedenbaugh and the vote to accept the first reading was unanimous.

Councilman Atkinson made a motion to accept the first reading of Ordinance number 05022023, intergovernmental agreement relating to SC revenue services. Councilmember Yongue made the second and the first reading was accepted unanimously.

Councilman Smith made a motion to place a dumpster at Ponderosa Park to be emptied weekly. Councilperson Bedenbaugh made the second. After some discussion, the Mayor said that he would talk to the County to see if they could provide this for us.

Councilmember Yongue made a motion to go into Executive Session, Councilmember Atkinson made the second, and all were in favor of going into Executive Session for the purpose of Contractual Matter and Committee Resignation.


Mayor Stoddard called the meeting back into regular session and asked if there were any motions. Councilmember Atkinson made a motion to accept the resignation letter of Ray Longenecker from the Planning Commission. Councilmember Bedenbaugh made the second and the vote was unanimous.

Mayor Stoddard adjourned the meeting at 7:58 PM.
